

The Seven Sacraments

Holy Orders: Any men exploring the possibility of becoming a Priest or Deacon or anyone contemplating Religious Life should contact the Office for Vocations of the Diocese of Pittsburgh at 412-456-3123.

Baptism: Second Sunday of the month by appointment. Arrangements are made through the Parish Office. Pre-Baptism instructions are obligatory.

Confirmation: Celebrated periodically as scheduled by the Diocese.

Holy Eucharist: First Communion is celebrated in the Spring. Call the Rectory to arrange for communion for those who are homebound.

Reconciliation: Saturdays from 11:00 A.M. to Noon and by appointment.

Matrimony: Couples must contact a parish priest six months prior to the proposed date. Marriage instructions are mandatory.

Anointing of the Sick: Celebrated the Third Sunday of the month after all Masses. If a family member is seriously ill or about to have surgery, please call a priest.

Please remember St. Joseph Parish in your will.

Words of Our Holy Father

The Son of God chose to be born into a human family, in an obscure town on the periphery of the Roman Empire. Although the Gospels tell us little about the first thirty years of his life, we can imagine that Jesus led a very "normal" family life. He was raised in an atmosphere of religious devotion, he learned from the words and example of Mary and Joseph, and he grew in wisdom, age, and grace (cf. Luke 2:52). In imitation of the Holy Family, every Christian family must make a place for Jesus in its home. For it is through the love of such "normal" families that God's Son quietly comes to dwell among us, bringing salvation to our world. . . .

And this is the great mission of the family: to make room for Jesus who is coming, to welcome Jesus in the family, in each member: children, husband, wife, grand-
parents. . . . Jesus is there. Welcome him there, in order that he grows spiritually in the family.



The Greatest Commandment - In today's Gospel Jesus makes his command of love succinct: Love God with all your heart, mind and soul and love your neighbor as yourself. While succinct, this command is not always simple. Sure, it may not be hard for many to not kill and to keep holy the Sabbath, but how about getting frustrated with God or others, or fulfilling our needs before what God or others expect of us. It can be hard to set aside our desires or what's convenient for us, yet we must be willing to do what honors God and builds up our sisters and brothers, no matter the personal cost involved. As *On Mission for The Church Alive!* unfolds our normal time or place of worshipping God may change and be less convenient, and that will be hard for us. That doesn't mean, however, that we give up on God or neglect our family of faith. *On Mission* seeks to make our worship of God more vibrant and our opportunities to build up the Body of Christ more effective. From the Desk of Father Ed:

This coming Tuesday is **Election Day**. It may not be as exciting as the Presidential Election last year but the right to vote is a precious part of our American heritage. *All elections are important*. Most public office holders begin their careers in local contests. Take advantage of the opportunity to participate in representative government.

There will be a **Cluster Baptism Class** here at Saint Joseph's on **Tuesday at 7 PM**. These are scheduled over ten months (two per parish). You must call to register for the class and then call to schedule an appointment for the actual baptism. *Parents **must attend*** this seminar and godparents are also invited to participate when possible.

Last week, we presented the dates for the Bishop's final decision on parish groupings, number of Masses per parish and clergy assignments. Certainly one factor, among many, concerns **Mass attendance** in each parish. In all honesty, this year's **October Count** is rather dismal. We are just barely above *500 attendees each weekend* for all three Masses. These numbers are also representative of our other local cluster parishes too. It is little wonder that action must be taken through the On Mission initiative.

Several months ago, we indicated that the Diocese was forming three district units to consolidate and run **parish cemeteries**. This process is underway in two sections of the diocese. *We have been informed that they will be coming here for our records within the next couple of weeks - certainly before Thanksgiving*. We had suggested that families try to make sure they are current with payments on cemetery plots to avoid undue stress when arrangements need to be made. If you need to attend to this duty, please make haste to do so over the next two weeks - after that, you will need to work with the new entity.

While the parishes are moving toward reorganization in a timely fashion, our schools are being evaluated on a regional basis. The process is intended to provide more reliable funding to the various regions of the diocese so that schools have adequate financing. Although this procedure is starting, *we need to do what we can now to provide for our own school*. Please continue to support our funding especially through our **monthly bingo and raffle, our continuing sale of grocery gift cards, the annual Night at the Races and the Spring Bingo**. Thanks to those who have been generous already through the **Purse Bash** and the recent **Gala**. It takes much effort to keep our school doors open - but we believe it is worthwhile!

Treasures From Our Tradition

What is the name of the pope's cathedral? If you said the Vatican, or St. Peter's, you were off by a few miles, since the answer is the Basilica of St. John, the Lateran, the "Mother Church" of all the churches of the world and the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome. It takes its name from the Lateran family, the Trumps of their day, who somehow ran afoul of the Emperor Nero. He seized all their property, including their vast Roman palace and estate. We don't know how Plautius displeased Nero so badly, but eventually all the Lateran property came to Constantine, the first Christian emperor, through his wife, Fausta. Early in the fourth century, when Christianity was at last legalized, Constantine gave the property to the church. Soon the great meeting halls were expanded and adapted.

Over the centuries, the church building has been sacked by armies, ruined by fire, torn down, and rebuilt. The oldest and most unchanged part of the Lateran is a vast, separate baptistery with steps leading down to a huge green basalt pool. Imagine what a triumphal moment the dedication of this public church building was for a community that had worshiped in secret for so long! This Thursday's feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica is really about the tradition of consecrating space for worship, and so by extension, a feast for your parish church building and, given the beautiful second reading, for its baptistery as well.
